

I'm so glad Frances worked with IT and NOBLE a few summers ago to simplify our off-campus login process! Getting faculty and students the right e-materials is a high priority this year. I am meeting with Frances on Tuesday to iron out streaming media guidelines so that we can share them with our streaming media subgroup, the Library Resources Committee, and librarians.



We will return to face-to-face instruction beginning on Wednesday, October 7. Merrimack will be hosting an additional flu clinic today Monday, Oct. 5, and Tuesday, Oct. 6. from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. in the MPR. Pre-registration is required. Click here to register.

Please continue to attend your regular scheduled COVID testing appointments. If anyone missed their regular testing last week and have a "Restricted" designation on the campus app, please let security at the gate know that you are reporting directly to the testing center. Upon arrival to campus on the first day back, please report directly to the testing center and limit your movements on campus until a negative result is received. In addition to testing on the first day back, employees should continue to attend their regular scheduled testing appointment. That may mean they need to have two tests this week, but that is okay! This is to ensure they get back on their 7-day testing schedule.

I can't wait to get the Merrimack College community ready to vote! McQuade Library is co-hosting a panel this Tuesday, 10/6, at 5pm with our very own MC Professors discussing why they vote and answering questions. Stay tuned for more voter engagement efforts too; we are planning a program with a representative from the League of Women Voters who will give a non-partisan presentation and share what we need to know to vote.



I am also looking forward to attending a fun Graphic Novel event sponsored by the Office of Multicultural Programming. We will zoom with author Hector Rodriguez who has illustrated and authored a graphic novel starring a Mexican superhero who fights injustice in the form of government corruption, drug cartels, and human trafficking on the U.S.-Mexico border. We will add this book to McQuade's graphic novel collection as these materials are used as teaching tools across all MC schools.



Frances and I are meeting with the Library Resources Committee faculty on Tuesday to set the year's objectives and agenda. We will be working with these faculty members to gain feedback and develop guidelines for responding to increased requests for streaming media and digital collections.

Finally, I'm thrilled to say we will have an app for that (that is, asking a McQuade librarian for help!). We are rolling out a new "Ask a Librarian" mobile app. Instruction librarians are testing it now and will be promoting it. Stay tuned for more details next week!

Looking ahead I see at least **8** student research appointments/consultations booked this week through our system. Students are reaching the point in the semester where they are engaged in research and writing assignments and seeking assistance.

All Abilities Awareness

Every year McQuade Library partners with our friends in the Accessibility Services Office for *All Abilities Awareness*. This year our theme is "Diversability" as we recognize and celebrate diverse abilities during the month of October. I'm excited that one of our MACKchats (one of my favorite events of the year) will be a virtual "Unity in Diversity" event on Tuesday, 10/13. We are also hosting an All Abilities art gallery (both in-person at McQuade and virtual), where community members can display their drawings, writing, photography, or preferred medium. 

Resource Management



NECHE Update

Merrimack must meet a set of standards developed by the New England Commission on Institutions of Higher Education (NECHE) in order to receive a renewal of accreditation. NECHE measures colleges and universities in the region, making sure they are providing students with a quality education through their programs and services. Here a few NECHE library-related sub-standards, though more relate to library:

- 7.22 The institution provides access to library and information resources, services, facilities, and qualified staff sufficient to support its teaching and learning environments and its research and public service mission as appropriate.
- 7.24 The institution's physical and electronic environments provide an atmosphere conducive to study and research.
- 4.12 Expectations for student achievement, independent learning, information literacy, skills in inquiry, and critical judgment are appropriate to the subject matter and degree level and in keeping with generally accepted practice.

I have had many good conversations with **Julie Fitzmaurice** who is leading efforts to gather and report data and evidence to illustrate how MC meets and exceeds these standards. McQuade Library is an important part of this process and we are working together to gather evidence such as usage statistics, our library's annual reports, faculty research statistics, and more to share our story of how McQuade Library has evolved and continues to contributes to teaching and learning in many different ways and exceed NECHE standards. Shoutout to Frances for gathering and reporting collections data. Julie and I brainstormed many ideas, but one that we had was to create a McQuade timeline to illustrate how McQuade has evolved/transformed over the last decade. We went 24/5, launched a liaison program for faculty, increased e-collections, and added streaming media- to name just a few things.


Librarians are available during remote reading days and the finals period, so please spread the word if you work with any students who need research assistance.

McQuade staff members continued to help students wherever they are, with librarians being available through email, telephone, and chat to answer both quick questions and in-depth inquiries. Our extensive range of online collections (e-books, e-journals, streaming media) and programs supported hyflex learning. McQuade Librarians continued to work with instructors to develop workshops and other electronic materials tailored to specific courses and online assignments.

We were thrilled to host our first Community Engagement fellow and Health Sciences Intern, both whom not only implemented but truly elevated engagement and partnerships at McQuade during a semester when it was much needed.

I want to thank everyone for their patience, flexibility, and grit during this unusual semester. I appreciate all that each of you are doing to keep McQuade on our path forward. I hope you all enjoy your winter break; please give yourself permission to step away from work, so that you can return with energy and renewed focus.

Stream it!

Streaming video usage skyrocketed this semester! We experienced a **205**% increase from last fall. **WOW!** We began a streaming media group and will offer a "What's Streaming" CETL workshop for faculty in January. Frances and Chris Coflan will continue to compile, analyze, and share usage statistics for all our e-resources, but this statistic is noteworthy.

Library Workshops

We facilitated **82** online and in-person research instruction workshops this semester across all schools. We created many instructional videos and continued to expand our collection of research guides. Here are some faculty comments about our workshops from our end-of-semester survey:

These workshops are particularly useful in courses which emphasize a heavy writing component. Upper level courses could benefit as juniors and seniors often require a refresher.


The course required a literature review and students needed to search for peer-reviewed articles. The workshop significantly helped my students to find the related and appropriate articles.

Finding the correct resources in writing a manuscript is an important aspect of scientific writing. I saw students' improvement in this area after the workshop.

Many students never did a research paper before this class and they did an excellent job with their research.

Students had disparate library research skills and this workshop contributed towards bridging their respective educational/research gaps.

Improved the quality and relevance of the materials cited; showed evidence of improved critical thinking in source selection/use; evidenced that sources are cited correctly.
